We have lots of items due. The easiest way to pay and complete permission notes is through School Bytes, which you can access through the website – make a payment button (or there is an app)

School Bytes allows you to give permission for events / make a payment and see payment history.

If you use the same email address as the one listed in the office, you should be able to join school bytes automatically, otherwise give the office a call and we can send you a linking code.

If you are having trouble making a payment - once in the school bytes page, go over to the activities/notes tab and complete the permission and this will then allow the payment option to open.

Please pop into the office if you require assitance accessing the Bytes portal – it can be done on your phone or computer


